Paper must exhibit high-quality writing and include a clear thesis.	Paper must exhibit high-quality writing and include a clear thesis.
Paper must be of interest to a general audience.	Paper must be of interest to a general audience.

Resubmitted papers will not be accepted unless substantially revised.

Only one submission per student.

You will complete a cover sheet with identifying information.
